Objectives: At the conclusion of this program, participants should able to:

- Describe the process changes related to the Statement of Conditions and Plan for Improvement.
- Identify the structure of The Joint Commission, Hospital Accreditation Program Environment of Care and Life Safety standards.
- Explain the content and requirements of the Environment of Care standards and the administrative requirements of the Life Safety Chapters.
- Recall the recent changes to the Environment of Care and Life Safety chapters and determine key program management requirements within those chapters.
- ▶ Identify strategies to use The Joint Commission standards as a framework for effective program management.
