Background

- Session Law 2020-88, Medicaid Transformation effective July 1, 2021.
- FFY2021 DSH/MRI/GAP Plan through June 30, 2021.
- Last Update October 2019 Informational Rate Letters to Providers.

Current State

- Base Payments at \$2,704 per CMI adjusted discharge and teaching hospitals receive a per discharge add-on for GME.
- Supplemental Payments
 - DSH Payments
 - Deficit payments
 - Upper Payment Limit Payments
- Annual Cost Report Settlement
 - Acute Care 70% Medicaid allowable OP cost
 - CAH 100% Medicaid allowable IP & OP cost

Future State

- Current deficit and UPL payments (less GME) will be incorporated into enhanced, hospital specific inpatient and outpatient base rates, based on FFY2018 MRI/GAP Plan.
- These rates will apply in both FFS and Managed Care.
- The new inpatient and outpatient base rates will serve as a "rate floor" for Managed Care, excluding behavioral health claims. PHPs and providers may mutually agree to alternate amount or methodology.
- PHPs shall negotiate rates with hospitals for behavioral health claims.
- CAHs inpatient rates are set to approximate each CAH's current FFS per-discharge reimbursement, including base and supplemental payments.
- Annual rate adjustments (CMS inpatient PPS market basket updates less productivity adjustment).

Future State

- Outpatient Rates
 - Base rates set to approximate 100% of costs based on each hospital's RCC contained in 2018 MRI/GAP Plan, adjusted annually by inflation and changes in hospital specific charge master.
 - Annual rate adjustments (CMS inpatient PPS market basket updates less productivity adjustment).
- DSH and Graduate Medical Education Payments
 - These payments will continue to be made directly to eligible hospitals and will not be a component of IP or OP Base Rates.
- Cost Report Settlement will end as of June 30, 2021 Date of Service.

Funding

- Session Law 2020-88 identifies Base and Supplemental Assessments required to fund new methodology under Medicaid Transformation.
- Critical Access Hospitals remain exempt from both of these assessments.
