



## **Behavioral Health Inpatient**


## **Utilization Dashboard**


In 2022, **7**% of Inpatient hospitalizations (IP) were for behavioral health. Of those **1,075,976 visits**, the majority were for Mental Health, and a smaller percentage for Substance Abuse. People between ages 25-44 have the most inpatient hospitalizations compared to the percent of that age group in the NC population.







Rates of inpatient hospitalization for behavioral health has remained fairly consistent over the past three years for adults and has decreased slightly in 2022 for pediatric patients.





Hospitalizations for behavioral health are higher than the population for patients who are Black and whose primary payer is Medicare or Medicaid.





Average length of stay is longer for behavioral health patients than those with other conditions across payers. It is especially high for Medicare patients.
